Air Force Director for Cyberspace Innovation Kicks Off 2019 Professional Development Luncheons

Your AFA Gabriel Chapter kicked off the New Year for the January 9th Lunch Meeting at Maggiano's Little Italy Restaurant in McLean, VA. Our guest speaker was Ms. Lauren Knausenberger, who is the Director, Cyberspace

Innovation, Director of Spark Tank, U.S Air Force. She recently joined the Air Force to drive innovation across the DoD, speed adoption of emerging technologies, and create stronger partnerships between DoD, start-ups, and the venture community.

Ms. Knausenberger spoke on three topics: Multi-Domain Command and Control (MDC2), Software Acquisition, and Innovation

Air Force Chief of Staff, General David Goldfein, reframed the concept of Multi-Domain Operations (MDO) as MDC2 at the AFA As Conference in September. Knausenberger described the environment, the AF has a plethora of sensors and well understands how to do sensors. She believed we are 2-3 years away from ubiquitous worldcommunications, enabled bγ numbers of small satellites. Security is available with no or undetectable latency. Given that environment, the Vice Chief of Staff, General "Seve" Wilkson proposed a MDO challenge:

Why can't Search and Rescue be as easy as Uber on the battlefield? Instead of citing all the reasons it can't be so, figure out how to make it happen. That is the environment enables by a MDC2 future.

Which brings us to Software Acquisition. Knausenberger understands that airmen have the necessary "mission intimacy" to understand the problems. New generations of operator have ideas to provide the solutions. The Navy, SOCOM, Army Futures Showcase in Las Vegas, SIBR program are all attempting to get solution providers engage with airmen. to Knausenberger noted that the day before her General presentation. Maior Pat Higby announced at AFCEA Small Business Forum the "AF Pitch Day" March 6-7 in NYC. The Pitch Day will feature "on the spot" contract awards. The Air Force will still necessary to perform due diligence, but capabilities can be bought with a credit card.

Agile software development exploded into the Air Force with the Kessel Run Experimentation Lab (KREL) under the Digital Program Executive Office (PEO Digital) in Boston, Massachusetts. Knausenberger asked, "Do you know why they called it Kessel Run? Because just like the notorious smuggler Han Solo in the Star Wars movies, KREL had to smuggle modern software development into the Air Force. Knausenberger noted that KREL has been a success - saved "billions" of dollars. The concept is being replicated with the KREL-like factory for space industry at Space and Missile Center in Los Angeles, California -- Kobayashi Maru is the name. Honorable Rich Aldridge is implementing the Bespin SW factory for PEO Business — Bespin is the factory planet in the Star Wars universe — Gold mine in logistics supply chain innovation.

This event is one of monthly programs that the Gabriel Chapter hosts for the professional development of our AFA membership. Many of our members are corporate partners who advance the AFA mission.

Ms. Knausenberger's remarks were widely praised by Chapter members. Her remarks highlighted the many successes achieved so far in innovation of information technology, but also showed how much more there is to accomplish. Chapter President Mike Winters expressed the appreciation of the Chapter for her time and thought provoking presentation. He presented Ms. Knausenberger with a Gabriel Chapter challenge coin.

NRO Senior Enlisted Leader Tells Gabriel Chapter Members Why They Should Sleep Better at Night

Cannon, USAF, who is the Senior Enlisted Leader, Mission Operations Directorate, National Reconnaissance Office (NRO), Headquarters Chantilly, VA. Cannon advises the Director and senior staff of the Directorate on the health, welfare, and morale of the enlisted force and their families. He assists in leading more than 4,500 active duty and civilian personnel from all five military Services within the directorate's Headquarters, Wing, and five subordinate Groups. Cannon also keeps a watchful eye across numerous, geographically separated locations The Director of the NRO is worldwide. responsible for space-based intelliaence supporting National, DoD, and other Intelligence Agencies employing \$1B annual budget and 50+ contracts.

Mobilization Assistant to Under Secretary of the Air Force Gives Gabriel Chapter Members Insight into FY2020 Budget Request

The Guest Speaker for our March 2019 Chapter Professional Development Luncheon Maggiano's Little Italy Restaurant in McLean, Virginia was Brigadier General Jay "Scott" Goldstein, long time member and friend of the Gabriel Chapter and a frequent speaker at our Professional Development meetings. Mobilization Assistant to the Under Secretary of the Air Force, Brig Gen Goldstein assists the Under Secretary in the affairs of the Department of the Air Force, including the organizing, training, equipping and providing for the welfare of approximately 670,000 active duty, Guard, Reserve and civilian Airmen and their families world-wide. He helps oversee the Air Force's annual budget of over \$190 billion and directs

strategy and policy development, risk management, weapons acquisition, technology investments and human resource management across a global enterprise. He is responsible for assisting the Under Secretary in implementing decisions of the President and Congress, and fulfilling Combatant Commanders' current and future operational requirements.

At our March luncheon, Brig Gen Goldstein was able to describe key elements of the Air Force budget request, which puts the meat on the bones of the Air Force Posture Statement FY The AFPS notes that Great Power competition has reemerged as the central challenge to U.S. prosperity and security. At our AFA ASC Conference last September, SECAF Heather Wilson briefed that, based on the results of an in-depth analysis of what the Air Force needs to implement the National Defense Strategy, "The Air Force is too small for what the nation is asking us to do. The Air Force We Need has 386 operational squadrons by 2030." Brig Gen Goldstein was able to explain the national security challenges faced by the Air Force and the budget decisions in the President's Budget Request that will lead to the Air Force We Need, and a digital Air Force.

Brig Gen Goldstein rotates frequently in his position as a Mobilization Assistant with a highly technical background. He has served in similar positions assisting the Commander at Air Force Research Laboratory, 24th Air Force, and the Air Force Space and Missile Center before assuming his current position. Each time he changes jobs, he has graciously briefed Chapter Membership on the mission issues and priorities at each organization. At this February's meeting we were graced to be joined by Brig Gen Goldstein's wife, Polly.

The Chapter is grateful to Brig Gen Goldstein for his excellent presentation and his long-standing commitment to the Gabriel Chapter. We are also grateful for Scott and Polly's enduring friendship. Thank you to the Goldstein family for their service to the Gabriel Chapter and to the Nation.

Wreaths Across America

On 18 January 2019, Gabriel Chapter members led by our project leader, Pat Rocke, joined thousands of volunteers to recover and retire the

400,000 wreaths laid on the graves of our veterans in December.

Pat Rocke and Virginia AFA Sectretary, Dallas Kennedy, along with several of Pat's cousins and friends were crew chiefs for more than a dozen dumpsters in one section of the cemetery for the annual Wreaths Across America Retirement, where all 255,000 wreaths put out in December 2018 were removed from the grave sites at Arlington National Cemetery. Joined by Chapter Past President Joe Burke and other chapter officers and other members, our AFA team led cleanup of more than 40,000 wreaths.

Thanks in particular to Chapter lead Pat Rocke for his hard work and leadership for our Chapter on this event. Thanks to all members of the team, who came out to work and made the day a great success.

AFA and Virginia Veterans

Your AFA is represented by Governor's appointment to the Joint Leadership Council (JLC) of Veterans Services Organizations. This Council gives one voice to the interests of more than 840,000 Virginia veterans. The JLC supports the Department of Veteran Affairs and provides direct input to the Governor and General Assembly for annual budget items and legislation to further the interests of veterans and their families in Virginia. The stated goal is to make Virginia the most "veteran friendly state in the union." Major programs of interest are the Virginia Wounded Warrior Program (not to be confused with the national Wounded Warrior Project), the construction of two new Veteran Care Centers (one in Hampton Roads), the maintenance of three Veteran Cemeteries (one in Suffolk), support for the Virginia War Memorial, and specific programs like the Veterans, Education, Training and Employment. Veterans' Corner

These are two items of interest from the Virginia Department of Veteran Services to pass along to our AFA members.

The Virginia War Memorial Foundation presented the 5th Annual Commonwealth's Patriot Day Ceremony, Tuesday, September 11 in the Memorial's Heilman Amphitheater in Richmond. The ceremony honored nearly 3,000

who perished during the terrorist attacks in New York City, on Flight 93 in Pennsylvania, and at the Pentagon in Arlington on September 11, 2001. September 11 is officially designated as Patriot Day by the U.S. Congress as a national day of mourning and remembrance.

The keynote speaker for the ceremony was Melvin D. Carter, Chief of Fire and Emergency Services for the City of Richmond. Chief Carter is a Marine veteran and serves in the Virginia National Guard. The program included patriotic music performed by the 380th Army Band Ensemble and soloist Bethany Gates. Sailors from Navy Recruiting District, Richmond were ushers and supervised parking.

The VWM Walkway of Honor was established many years ago when JLC members and BVS members pooled resources to purchase paver bricks. The Foundation's Development Coordinator, Brenna Magette encourages Virginia Veterans I to buy a brick to support the War Memorial. More information on their website:



Gabriel Chapter Top Ten Tips for Recruiting and Retaining Members

The General Charles A. Gabriel Chapter has been recognized for a successful retention program. AFA Field Operations asked Chapter President Joe Burke for his secrets to success. Here are ten tips that Joe shared with our AFA National Field Operations Staff. How has the Chapter been so successful at growing new members and retaining existing members? Joe said, "My usual answer is that there is no magic to retention, that it just takes some commitment and to remember it's a contact sport."

Here are the Gabriel Top Ten Tips for Retention:

- 1. Chapter Programs and Events That Offer Value to Members People join the Association for different reasons and have varying interests in AFA programs. Retention starts with running balanced Chapter programs that advance the AFA mission -- Advocating for Airpower, developing Aerospace Education and supporting Airmen and Families while offering "something for everyone." Our membership events bring active duty and reserve component speakers who present on topics that serve the AFA mission. We have at least one Chapter social event a year and we run monthly meetings in different locations throughout our AOR to make it easier for members to attend.
- 2. **Communicate with our Membership.** We have a great communications team with VP for Communications, Jack Diamond, and VP for Social Media, Sam Shelton. Every week we notify members about upcoming Chapter events through our Quarterly Newsletter, Chapter website, Facebook page, and Constant Contact email notifications.
- 3. Reach Out to First Year Members and Transfers We download the Chapter membership roster monthly (or whenever it's updated by national) and contact new members to make sure they know we are their Chapter and are ready to help them get active in our Association.
- 4. **Don't Take Attendance** -- We understand that they can't get to some or even most of our events due to active duty, work or family commitments. We make it clear that if they can participate in only <u>one</u> of our events, they are still making a difference. Even for our Executive Committee Members, we consider participation voluntary whatever time they can commit is valued and appreciated.
- 5. Track Status with AFA Provided Reports We download our Roster from the AFA website when it is updated around mid-month. The Update Roster lists all members who are coming up for renewal or whose memberships are expiring. The roster also tells us whether or not a member we previously contacted about re-upping has actually renewed his or her membership.
- 6. **Watch the AFA Retention Training Module** The Retention training module on the AFA website goes through the entire process, including the how to use the rosters for Chapter retention.
- 7. **Assign a Chapter Lead for Membership** Our Chapter VP for Membership is currently vacant. Nevertheless, one person needs to lead the Retention effort. So our Chapter President has stepped in, assisted by other Executive Committee (EXCOM) members. The Chapter President owns and leads our program. It takes a group of people to implement, but one person is responsible.
- 8. **Retention is a Contact Sport** We personally contact each member. Usually the member has already been contacted by AFA National, with letters and emails. We assign a real person to reach out with personal contact by telephone or email -- to each member who is up for renewal.
- 9. Retention is Also a Team Sport Whenever possible; we make sure that the person who recruited the member, or who knows him or her best, reaches out to make the contact. For all others, we divvy up the list among the EXCOM. In the end, an assigned sponsor (retention committee or a member who knows them) contacts the member and provides that personal touch.
- 10. Follow-up Every month our VP for Membership audits the membership roster to see who renewed. We follow-up with any disconnects and confirm the member's status. Sometimes a member confirms that they renewed their membership even though they do not show up on the roster. So we have to call AFA HQ membership and resolve the issue. AFA HQ is always ready to assist us!
